- Pray for one another, those on the prayer list, those in our community, leaders at all levels.

# Vestry Meeting Summary Wednesday, July 18, 2021

<u>Minutes</u> of the June 16 meeting were presented, reviewed and after a motion was made to correct a couple grammatical errors, minutes were approved unanimously by acclimation as written and circulated with the noted corrections.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Snapshot of financial status was presented and reviewed. Jeannie was not present but did report that the church is in good shape and felt that June was unusually good for offerings and pledges submitted compared to previous years. Report was unanimously accepted by the vestry.

#### **Action Items**

<u>Update from Senior Warden</u> Jeff wanted to thank everyone for the prayers and support for him and his family on the death of his sister.

He feels 99.5 feedback of our regathering process has been positive. Most of the questions from a small percentage have been regarding how much longer to wear masks. Also being asked is the return to Wednesday night service? Thinking back over the past few months of implementing regathering - we have learned as we went, and with a few modifications it has gone very well. He stated he couldn't have done it without the Vestry's help.

Report from the Priest in Charge - Rev. Linda reported working with Judy Peterson and with Sally's schedule to have the memorial service for Eddie Peterson Thursday morning, full service with communion outside, with interment of ashes in the Memorial Garden. They also had a dedication of the dogwood tree placed in honor of Eddie Peterson in front of Parish House. A plaque has been placed at the base of the tree.

Rev. Linda continues to work through the list as she utilizes current lay ministers and lay readers and is also trying to expand both lists. She is trying to contact the young people to enlist them to serve as an Acolyte.

She is working on deciding when to do blessing of the backpacks. Gordon County schools go back August 6, Calhoun City schools resume on August 11<sup>th</sup>. She will call parents to see what will work best for most.

Office Administrator Kerry Nance will be working an abridged schedule the next few weeks as she deals with some medical issues so she won't be in the office Continued on Page 2

on a regular scheduled basis. She will be working from home when possible and the current protocols still support church employees working from home as much as possible with possibly one or two days in office as necessary. Also, there are still some inventory items to be transferred from Transfiguration Church in Rome IE: Hymnals, office supplies, cleaning supplies.

Feedback/Discussion regarding update to protocols

Discuss Registration and seating – We will still offer online registration, if congregants show up without pre-registering we will try to go ahead and accommodate them as seating allows. We will continue to maintain the social distancing inside the church at three feet apart, every other row closed off, and if crowded we could put some people in the middle of a roped off row. A seating chart and at least a list of who attended the service still needs to be kept.

Discuss returning hymnals and prayer books - Dale has attended all previous Diocesan Covid sanitation meetings, and believes that because we fog to sanitize after every meeting that we would be fine using hymnals and prayer books. Vestry approved. They will be placed in the church before next Sunday.

Virtual recording - Jess is out of town the next two weeks; Dale is filling in for him. We need a team to rotate on a schedule. Three or four people at least. A note will be place in the PARCHMENT asking for volunteers to rotate recording and virtually upload the weekly service.

Facility sanitizing – Jeff and Lyle are alternating completing it now. They need one or two more volunteers on this team. A note will be place in the PARCHMENT asking for volunteers.

Wine and Bread - Louise brought up the question of using individual prepackaged wafers and wine cups. Rev. Linda stated as far as she knows the Bishop has not approved these. But she will check on it.

Masks – Due to the Delta variant increasing, death numbers increasing, hospitalizations increasing, and a high percentage of Gordon County citizens still not vaccinated, masks will still be required. We need to keep on wearing our masks as representative of our love and concern for each other.

Established Vestry Member of the Day/Ushers for each service through August 29

Church Organ - Rev Linda has located and contacted Allen Organ Company in Atlanta, they said they support our manufacturers equipment/ instruments. They need a model number for our specific organ. She will email it to them Monday morning.

Wednesday night service - There have been some inquiries about when we plan to reinstate Wednesday evening service and dinner. After discussion we will revisit this after Labor Day. But possibly opening with service only at first and not providing a meal. Our Diocese states no common cup and no food, or open food service at this time.

Diocesan Assessment - Our annual assessment is coming due to the Diocese, this is where we make our 10% commitment. This will be signed and turned in on time on or around Aug. 15.

be two individuals. This meeting still may be a zoom meeting format or possibly could be in person. Jeff and Richard Shaw attended this meeting last year and Jeff suggested someone else should attend this year. We will have to have a decision by next Vestry meeting. Let Jeff know if you think of someone that would be willing and interested in attending, he will call them.

Evaluating/Updating 6-month goals at August Vestry meeting - Jeff included the goals we currently have set from February 2021 in the email for the Vestry meeting. We will discuss the goals and review our progress as a parish and Rev. Linda's first six-month accomplishments and service at the August Vestry meeting.

Process of mulching the Memorial Garden - Daniel Bennett noted that the Memorial Garden needs mulching. He is willing to take care of it and Jeff will assist him. Vestry decided to have Daniel purchase and place the mulch using brown or black mulch. He will submit his receipts and he will be reimbursed.

#### **Committee Reports**

Sunday School - ready for backpack blessing, date of when that will be is being set up.

Rev. Linda will call parents to find the best dates. Vestry decided to have a "Cookies and Lemonade" time after church. It will happen outside in the Memorial Garden. One person in mask and gloves will pour drinks in disposable cups, cookies will be individually packed.


