# Vestry Meeting Summary Sunday, June 12, 2022

Meeting called to order with prayer by Rev. Linda Baker Pineo.

**Minutes** of previous meeting were approved as presented.

**Vestry affirmed the email vote of 6/8/22** approving the use of Building Funds to replace the air conditioning for downstairs and upstairs in the church building for \$22,344.82

**Treasurer's Report** was presented with the information that as of June 12 the Building Fund has about \$20,000. The report will be filed for audit.

Since our last report, the Outreach Committee met in May and elected Terry Overlander as chairperson, Beth Vaughn was assigned by the Vestry as Vestry Liaison. The budget was reviewed, discussed, and amended. Check requests were made for Christmas in July in the amount of \$500 to purchase new underclothes for students going back to school, also \$400 to Prevent Child Abuse to be used for the education and prevention of child abuse.

It also instituted an underwear drive for the Christmas in July program, to help with what the Outreach has already purchased. Prices have gone up so much since last year, we wanted to make sure every child would be able to receive new underclothes. The Christmas in July Program helped 101 families last year that included 265 children from Pre-k through high school.

This month, June, we have requested \$300 to the Child Advocacy Center for the purchase of snacks for parents and children during supervised visitations; \$500 to the Bridge program to pay toward temporary housing of homeless so as to help them get back on their feet; finally we requested \$100 for the Hunger Walk, this will be used to purchase food for those in need.


