Vestry Meeting Summary Sunday, July 17, 2022

Present: Lisa Dunbar (Senior Warden), Lyle Currier (Junior Warden), Beth Vaughn (acting Secretary), Rev. Linda Pineo, Jess Shirley, George Trudell, Dan De Guire. **Absent:** Louise Purdy, Devon Smyth (Deacon Candidate), Jeannie Vaughan (Treasurer).

Meeting called to order with prayer by Rev. Linda Baker Pineo.

Minutes of previous meeting were approved as presented. **Treasurer's Report** was accepted.

Vestry affirmed the email vote of 7/1/22 approving the increase in 2022 budget "Reserves" amount by \$1800.

Item to be added to the Vestry Agenda was a recommendation that the Church Grounds Budget be amended to \$500. After discussion with the treasurer to determine the best source for this money, an approval vote will be taken at the August Vestry meeting.

Action Items

Pledge to the Diocese for 2023 requested is \$11,482.00 which is 10% of our average annual income during the last three years. This was approved.

Delegates to Diocesan Council (Nov. 11-12) An article in the August Parchment will request those interested in serving to contact Rev. Linda.

Report from the Priest in Charge (Rev. Linda) reminded vestry to complete Safeguarding Children/People and Dismantling Racism courses using the link provided.

Established VPOD for each service through August 2022. For other duties, we currently have these numbers of people serving in these ministries. Usher =16, Lector = 21, LEM = 7 More are always welcome. Rev. Linda will begin scheduling training.

Administrative questions raised in the June meeting were discussed.

Committee reports sent indicated only the Parish Life committee met. They presented a schedule for events through December. The Vestry is planning a parish work week for September 19-24th.

Future Calendar was approved with August 21 vestry meeting.

Vestry Retreat was canceled for this calendar year.

The July vestry meeting was adjourned with Prayer.



The 80th General Convention of The Episcopal Church is one for the history books, and not just for the decisions made but also for how the COVID-19 pandemic changed the way the church conducted its business.

The July 8-11 gathering – postponed a year because of COVID-19 and shortened from eight days – conducted what Presiding Bishop Michael Curry had referred to during the planning process as "matters essential for the governance and good order of the church." Still. 412 resolutions were filed for consideration.

Among these were additions to the Book of Common Prayer, including specifically

- translations of Enriching Worship and the Book of Occasional Services into other languages
- authorize the Book of Occasional Services, 2021
- authorize Lesser Feasts and Fasts 2018
- revision of Existing Calendar Commemorations
- Lesser Feasts and Fasts Revision Principles
- develop Local Commemorations
- Commons for Local Calendar Commemorations
- a Plan for Clarifying the Calendar of The Episcopal Church
- Additions to the Book of Common Prayer Calendar
- Authorize Holy Eucharist, Rite II, Prayer C (Expansive Language) for Trial Use

Also included more generally

- methods for use of electronic media for meetings
- investigations for safe churches
- improve integration of services for people of color, women, seniors, and others
- continuing support for ecumenical and interreligious relations and church planting
- continuing support and development for ministry for mental illnesses
- support truth telling, reckoning, and healing for any history of The Episcopal Church in US and world
- urge development and recognition of Indigenous Day and develop Liturgical Resources for same And, many other resolutions for support, direction, and development of The Episcopal Church.

Results of a new survey conducted by the Episcopal Church released on March 9, 2022. illustrates stark differences between how Christians and non-Christians view Christianity in the US. "There is a disconnect between the reality of Jesus and the perceived reality of Christians," said Presiding Bishop Michael Curry.

"This was an attempt on our church's part to actually listen to what others were saying about Jesus, about us. We dared to ask, 'How are we perceived?'" Curry said. After reviewing the data he stated, "The church has got a lot more to do, which is a good thing,"


