Meeting was called to order at 12:34 pm and led in prayer by Rev. Linda Pineo.

The minutes of the July 10 2022 meeting were presented and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Vestry accepted the Treasurer's Report as presented.

Action Items

- Delegates to Diocesan Council (Nov. 11-12) still looking for volunteers. We need to have the names turned in by mid-September. The meeting is at Holy Innocents. The church will pay for a Friday night hotel.
- Report from the Priest in Charge (Rev. Linda) Reminder from the bishop that his position on guns has not changed guns are not allowed on church property. Discussed need for a plan if an emergency arose during a worship service. Devon Smyth's Ordination will be Oct. 8th at the Cathedral.
- Establish VPOD for each service through Sept. 2022
- = **Hug Your Church week Sept 19-24** A list will be emailed in early September of what needs to be cleaned or fixed around the facility. Lisa Dunbar will have a list of inside tasks and Lyle Currier will have outside tasks. These

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will be on a spreadsheet in both buildings. People will be able to come that week, see what needs doing, and choose one or more things to do.

Policy of Committees – The Vestry viewed the Committee policy from 2012 and proposed changes. After review and discussion, a new policy was accepted.

Facilities: Church/Parish Hall Roof - 90% of the leak problem was a stopped-up drain, there are several areas that need patching, The drain should be cleaned out at least twice a year. Old windows are available. Lisa Dunbar will contact Gibson's in the Outlet mall and the Presbyterian church to sees if anyone else would like to purchase. All monies would be added to the Building Fund. The fence at the Potts' House was discussed as well as the state of the furniture on the Parish House porch.

Parish Life – Salacoa Creek Sept 11, 2 pm Church family picnic will be held at Salacoa Creek Park. An upcoming fundraiser was discussed with monies raised going to the Building fund as well as Grounds.

Education Committee – Sunday School to start in September, a planning meeting needs to be held soon.

PARISH PICNIC - Parish Life Committee will host a Parish Picnic on Sunday afternoon, September 11, from 2:00—8:00 pm at Salacoa Creek Park. The Committee will provide hot dogs, hamburgers, buns, and paper/plastic goods. Please bring a dish to pass and drinks for your family. Also bring lawn chairs, bug spray and outdoor games. Board games and card games are also welcome. A sign-up sheet will be posted!

OUTREACH COMMITTEE: During the August meeting, it was agreed to support the local schools by contributing \$300 to their Samaritan's Closet. The Closet allows any child to get school supplies, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, soap, deodorant, and ready-to-eat food items as needed. No questions asked. Each school in our city/county has a Closet. We also contributed \$600 to the Rockbridge Church to support the Backpack Buddies. They use these funds to purchase food from the Chattanooga Food Bank and fill the backpack of students in dire need. This allows the child to have food to eat over the weekend while school is closed. They supply to ten county and 5 city schools. That is approximately 60 backpacks of food per school are given out each weekend.
