Dear St. Timothy Folk, It's Advent!!

We have entered Advent, the season of anticipation and expectation in which we reflect on the coming ("advent") of Christ – his coming in the past as a babe in Bethlehem, his coming at the end of time to reign over all things, and his coming to us in our lives in the present. It is difficult not to get swept up in the flood of holiday and Christmas music, celebrations, shopping, cooking, and "stuff". Advent invites us to take time out to reflect on the messages of Advent, listen for God's voice and be aware of God's presence within and around us.

This is also the season for our Annual Parish Meeting, which will take place Sunday, December 4^{th} , at the end of the 11:00 a.m. service. The Treasurer will provide a financial statement of the Parish through October 31^{st} , and short reports will be given.

That evening, we will celebrate our Holiday Dinner at 5:00 p.m.

An important part of Advent is preparing for the annual remembrance of our Savior's birth, the feast we call Christmas. We will have 2 services on Christmas Eve. The first, at 4:00 p.m., will be modified for our youngest members with a shorter set of lessons and fewer verses to the carols. In place of a homily, I will read a wonderful picture book to the children (and adults), and then we will share prayers and Communion. This is a good service for families with children and grandchildren, and for those who prefer not to drive after dark.

The other service will be at 11:00 p.m. with a time of Christmas carols beginning at 10:30 p.m. This service will be the full Eucharist for

After two years of pandemic-induced online sessions, Episcopalians from throughout Middle and North Georgia gathered in person on November 11 and 12 for the 116th Annual Council of the Diocese of Atlanta.

Bishop Rob Wright, who resumed his practice of individually greeting attendees as they arrived, said online gatherings accomplished the official work of Council but lacked the personal interactions that are a vital part of the largest annual gatherings of the diocese.

"It is so good to see you all, and not in those little boxes," Wright told the more than 450 delegates, visitors, vendors, and guests who filled the main gymnasium of the Holy Innocents' Episcopal School in Atlanta. "Our commitment to be an inclusive church is not based on a social theory or capitulation to the ways of the culture, but on our belief that the outstretched arms of Jesus on the cross are a sign of the very love of God reaching out to us all."

Epiphany, The

The manifestation of Christ to the peoples of the earth. The winter solstice was kept on Jan. 6 at some places during the first centuries of the Christian Era. In opposition to pagan festivals, Christians chose this day to celebrate the various manifestations, or "epiphanies," of Jesus' divinity. These showings of his divinity included his birth, the coming of the Magi, his baptism, and the Wedding at Cana where he miraculously changed water into wine. The day was called "The Feast of Lights." Celebration of the Son of God replaced celebration of the sun. Baptisms were done, and a season of preparation was instituted. It was later called Advent.

The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Feast of the Epiphany, Jan. 6, in the BCP. The Baptism of our Lord is celebrated on the First Sunday after the Epiphany.




COVER TO COVER Book Club



The Twelve Days of Christmas: The Meaning Behind The Song

The twelve days of Christmas are the twelve days between Christmas Day, Dec. 25th, the birth of Jesus, and the Epiphany, Jan. 6th, the day Christians celebrate the arrival of the Magi (Wise Men) and the revelation of Christ as the light of the world.

The Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" may sound silly and contrived to many of us. But it actually had its origins in religious symbolism - and with a serious purpose. It dates from a time of religious persecution. The song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas," was written as a kind of secret catechism that a person could sing in public without fear of arrest. It was a learning tool or memory aid to Christians in fact.

Popular folklore says that the song can be taken at two levels of interpretation: the surface meaning, and the hidden meaning known only to the Christians involved.

So here are the days, and the Christian teaching associated with them.

1. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus.

2. The two turtledoves are the Old and New

Testaments.

Three French hens stand for faith, hope and love.

The four calling birds are the four Gospels.

5. The five gold rings recall the Hebrew Torah (Law), or the Pentateuch, the first five books of the Old Testament.

The six geese a-laying stand for the six days of creation.

7. The seven swans a-swimming represent the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: apostles, prophets, teachers, miracles, healing, tongues, interpretation

8. The eight maids a-milking are the eight Beatitudes.

 Nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

10. The ten lords a-leaping are the Ten Commandments.

11. Eleven pipers piping represent the eleven faithful Apostles.

 Twelve drummers drumming symbolize the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostles Creed.



If you think Jesus being symbolized as a partridge in a pear tree sounds blasphemous, remember:

"Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered thee under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but thou wouldst not have it so." (Luke 13:34 and Matthew 23:34).

"My true love gave to me...." "True love" refers to God, the God of love.
