Dear St. Timothy Folk,

This year April leads us directly into Holy Week with **Palm Sunday/ Sunday of the Passion** on April 2nd. We will begin by celebrating Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem with lessons, psalm, hymn, and waving palms. Then we will transition during the service to the more solemn recitation of the Passion story.

Maundy Thursday we will join our brothers and sisters at First Presbyterian for the remembrance of the institution of the Eucharist. Good Friday we will hear again of Jesus' betrayal, trial, and crucifixion from the Gospel of John. Walking through these stories prepares us for the wonderful good news of Easter: Christ has conquered death, and we share in his Resurrection. This year we will celebrate Easter in our beautiful church with organ, piano, and choir. I encourage you to participate as much as possible, either by attending services, watching online, or reading through the prayerbook, and reflecting on the story of our salvation. Distraction may come from this also being the week of Spring Break for our K-12 schools.

The rest of April is the first half of the season of Easter, sometimes called Eastertide. On the Second Sunday of Easter, we hear John's account of Jesus appearing to the disciples on the evening of Easter Day. On the Third Sunday of Easter, we hear the report in the Gospel of Luke of two disciples encountering the

As The Episcopal Church's **Good Friday Offering** enters its second century, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry invites bishops, congregations, and supporters—in his annual Lent letter—into "that selfless way of living" demonstrated by Jesus of Nazareth on the cross.

"This coming Good Friday, April 7, I invite you into that selfless way of living through your part in the Good Friday Offering," Curry writes. "For 101 years, Episcopalians have lived out the song, 'If I Can Help Somebody,' by providing sight to people at the Ras Morbat Eye Clinic in Yemen, one of the poorest countries on earth; for a child to receive an education at Christ Anglican School in Nazareth; for a hospital in Nablus to welcome new births at a rate of 220 per month; for young deaf people to be cared for and taught life skills in Jordan."


"Your gifts to these places and many others 'spreads love's message' and enables both you and those you help to discover that 'our living shall not be in vain,'" Curry writes.

THANK YOU to all who donated cereal for VAC. The April food item is soup.


